

CRIMINAL PROCEDURE & EVIDENCE

Amy, Connie, and Vicky went to a bar to have some drinks. After an hour of drinking tequila, Amy and Vicky began to argue about which of them loved their neighbor, James, the most. Amy became enraged, grabbed a steak knife off of the table, and stabbed Vicky in the stomach as Connie held Vicky by her hair. When Police Officer Otis arrived at the bar, he handcuffed and arrested Amy and Connie. After Vicky was rushed to the hospital, Officer Otis took Amy into the bar's kitchen to question her. Officer Otis properly read Amy all of her rights, and Amy waived her rights and admitted that she had stabbed Vicky. Officer Otis then conducted a warrantless search of Connie's pickup truck, which was in the bar's parking lot. Under the driver's seat, he found a steak knife with blood on it.

Amy and Connie were charged by complaint with the second degree felony of aggravated assault with a deadly weapon, which is defined as "intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly causing bodily injury to another by use of a deadly weapon."
