
Scoring and Weighting the Texas Bar Exam (UBE)

Texas administers the Uniform Bar Exam. The minimum UBE total score required to be licensed in Texas is 270, reported on a 400-point scale.

The Texas Bar Examination has three parts, weighted as follows to calculate a UBE total score:

- Multistate Performance Test (MPT) = 20%
- Multistate Essay Examination (MEE)=30%
- Multistate Bar Exam (MBE) = 50%



The Multistate Performance Test (MPT) tests fundamental lawyering skills in a realistic situation. The MPT presents two tasks, to be completed in one 3-hour session, that a beginning lawyer should be able to accomplish. Each task is assessed on a 6-point scale, where a 6 is the highest possible score and 0 is the lowest possible score.

The Multistate Essay Examination (MEE) presents 6 essay questions to be answered in one 3-hour session. Each essay question is assessed on a 6-point scale, where a 6 is the highest possible score and 0 is the lowest possible score.

The Multistate Bar Examination (MBE) presents 200 multiple-choice questions to be completed in two 3-hour sessions. The MBE score is reported on 200-point scale.
